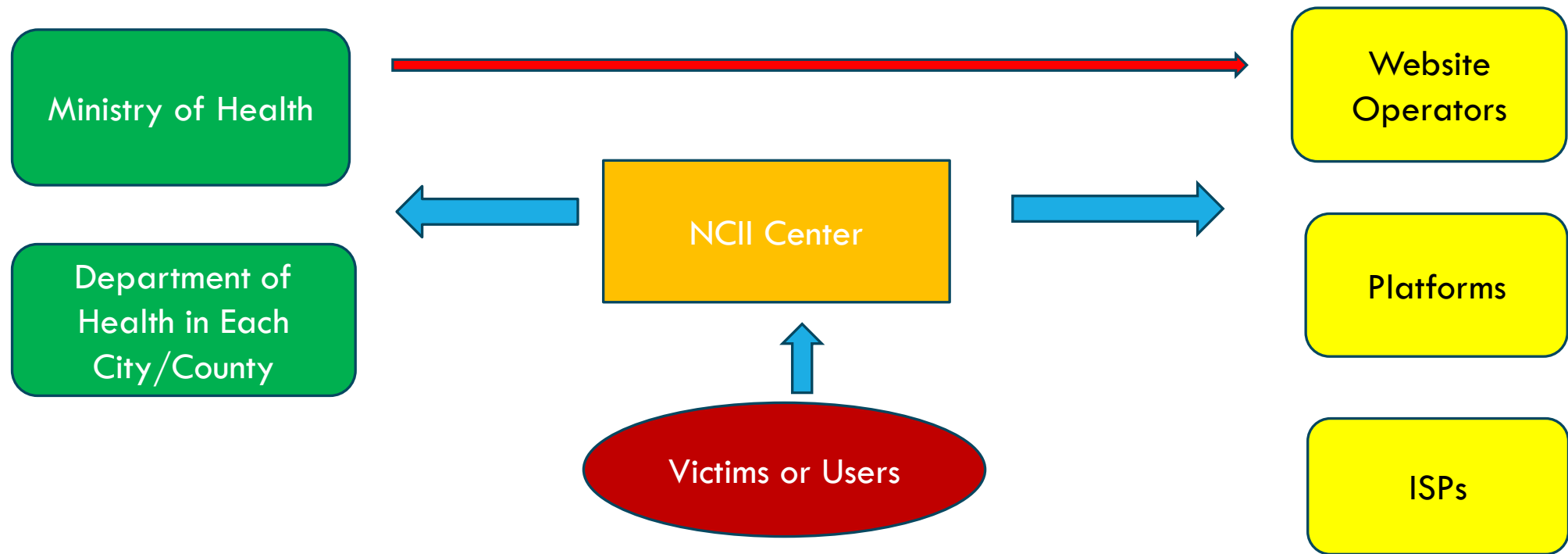

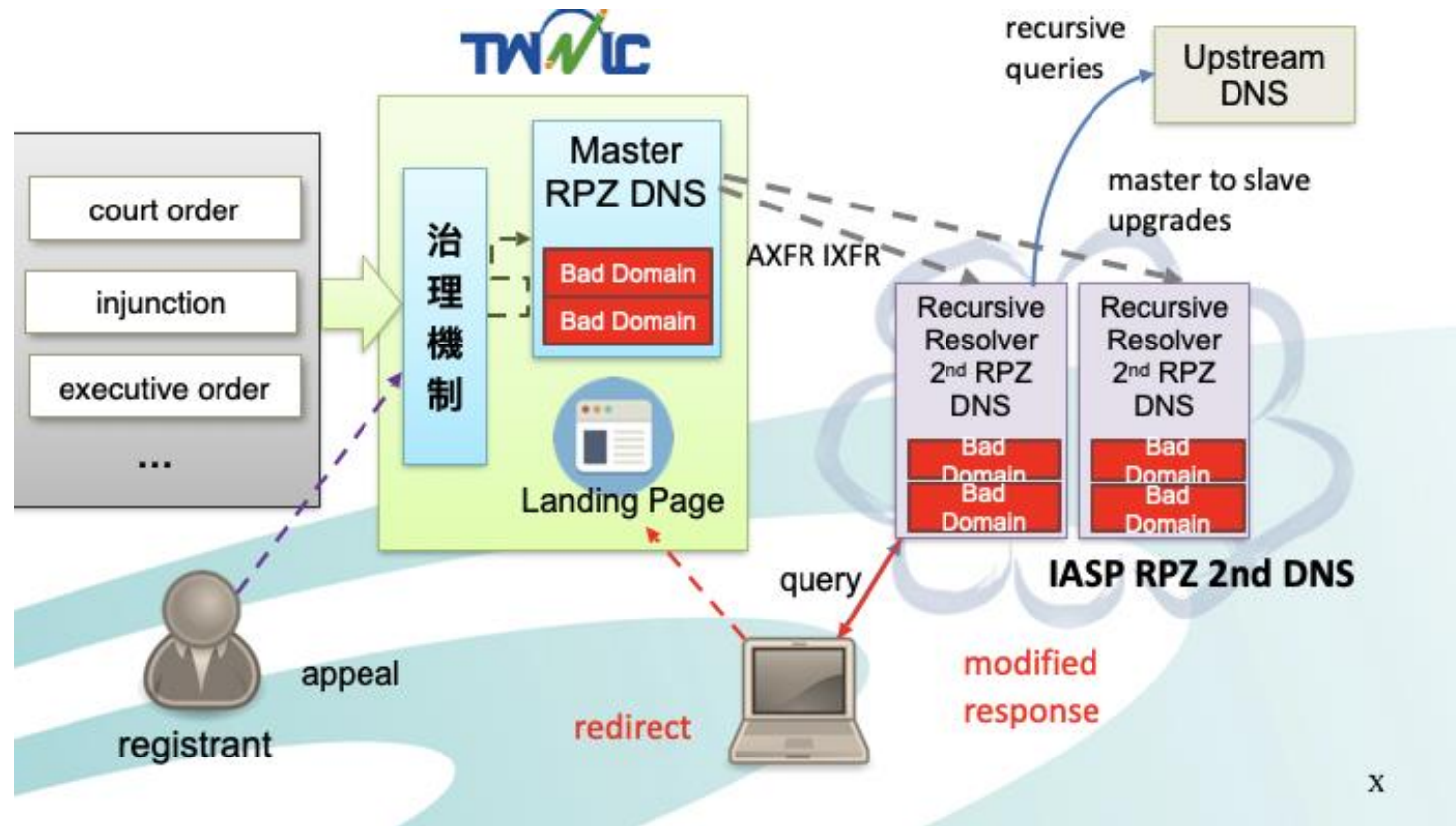

PPP MODEL NON-CONSENSUAL INTIMATE IMAGE

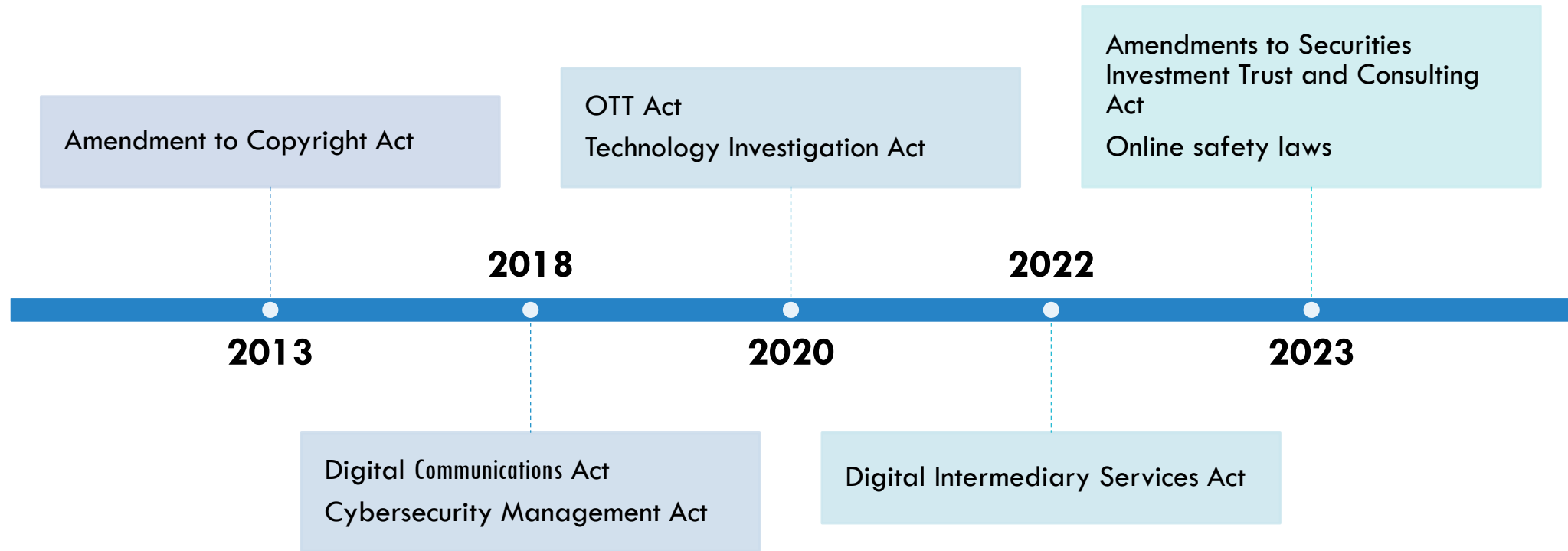

OTT Act

- Contents provided by illegal China enterprises
- Suspend services or disable the access

Digital Intermediary Services Act

- Illegal contents and Misinformation
- Information restriction orders issued by courts
- Warning notices by administrative departments

Amendment to Securities Investment Trust and Consulting Act

- Illegal ads
- Remove, restrict viewing or disable the access
- Joint liability

Online safety laws

- Non-consensual intimate images, etc.
- Remove, restrict viewing or disable the access
